Gift from a stranger

Cindi Love's name could not be more appropriate. She recently gave a special Valentine's Day gift to a total stranger who needed a new kidney. And she did it without hesitation.

Cindi first decided to become an organ donor when her 39-year-old nephew, Ken, learned he needed a kidney transplant. He had suffered from diabetes since age 11, and his kidneys were shot. Watching him go through so much turmoil, she immediately offered to donate her own kidney, but she wasn't a match.

As the family searched and prayed for a donor

match for Ken, Cindi did her own research and was shocked to discover Ken was one of almost 84,000 people waiting for a kidney transplant. She felt that even if she couldn't save her nephew's life, she **COULD** save someone's life – and she began the process to become a living donor.

"We're all really brothers and sisters in this world," she said. "I believe we're here for a reason, and one of those reasons is to help each other."

Through her research, Cindi came across a Web site dedicated to matching patients and donors, which she compares to an online dating site for kidney patients. She signed up with **MatchingDonors.com** and soon received e-mails from patients awaiting kidney transplants. Cindi sent a blood sample to Mayo Clinic in Rochester after receiving an e-mail from

one woman, but they weren't compatible. Soon after, Cindi received an e-mail from Tom Wirt, also a patient at Mayo. And this time, she was a match.

After about six months of tests, evaluations and prep work, Cindi was officially approved to donate one of her kidneys to Tom. She made the emotional phone call to tell him she was giving him a very special Valentine's Day gift – her left kidney. She flew from Florida to Minnesota on Valentine's Day, and they both underwent surgery on Feb. 17.

Tom has encountered some complications since the surgery, but the kidney is functioning beautifully. Cindi is back home and has been recovering well. And to make the ending of this amazing story even better, Ken got that magical phone call soon after and received a kidney/pancreas transplant March 10.

"I think she's the most wonderful person in the

world," said Tom. "She is very caring and a super Christian person. There are no words to thank her enough for what she did for me."

"I feel like I have a new brother," said Cindi. "We've kept in touch, they're letting me know the ups and downs, and I've kept them informed about my nephew. If I hadn't seen my nephew go through this turmoil, I don't know if it would've hit me. I saw it and thought, 'wow, this needs to happen.'"



Did you know April is National Donate Life Month? More than 106,000 people are awaiting lifesaving transplants, and a new person is added to the waiting list every 11 minutes. Transplant milestones



Thanks to a trial study, Eric has not needed anti-rejection medications for the past five years.

Eric Lindquenter took daily anti-rejection medications for 14 years. But thanks to a study at Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh, those days are over.

Born with biliary atresia, a rare and life-threatening liver disease, Eric received a liver transplant in 1990. He was only 5 months old. Today, Eric is an Eagle Scout and honor student in his freshman year of college.

Eric was one of the first patients to take the drug now known as Prograf, commonly prescribed as an immunosuppressant for transplant recipients. When he learned about the trial study at Children's Hospital, he jumped at the chance to wean himself off his anti-rejection medications. The weaning process took two years, but Eric has been Prograf-free for five years – and he's doing great!



Dr. Linda Cendales is changing lives through hand transplantation.

Several NFT staff and board members recently had the opportunity to meet with Dr. Linda Cendales, who is leading groundbreaking efforts in the area of hand transplantation. She has quite an impressive resumé and is overseeing the program at Emory Transplant Center in Atlanta. Dr. Cendales is the only surgeon in the United States with formal training in all three areas of hand, microsurgery and transplant surgery. She established a comprehensive program at Emory to study Vascularized Composite Allotransplantation (VCA), which is the transplantation of multiple tissues (skin, muscle, bone, cartilage, nerve, tendon and vessels) as a functional unit.

Hand transplants are currently under investigation and are often categorized as cosmetic surgery by insurance companies, so many patients do not have coverage for the expenses. Dr. Cendales sees the critical need for patients to regain mobility and motor skills, and she is dedicated to helping these patients.

NFT is committed to helping ALL transplant candidates and recipients raise funds to help with their expenses. As advances in the medical field continue to develop, we expect to see more patients in need of our services.
